The hail damaged homes, businesses, and automobiles. A damage survey estimated that approximately 980 homes and businesses suffered damage as a result of the hail, wind and rain. Also, the Texas Department of Public Safety reported numerous vehicles damaged by the hail. The supercell thunderstorm was finally forced east of the area as an eastward-moving area of thunderstorms approached the area from the west.
