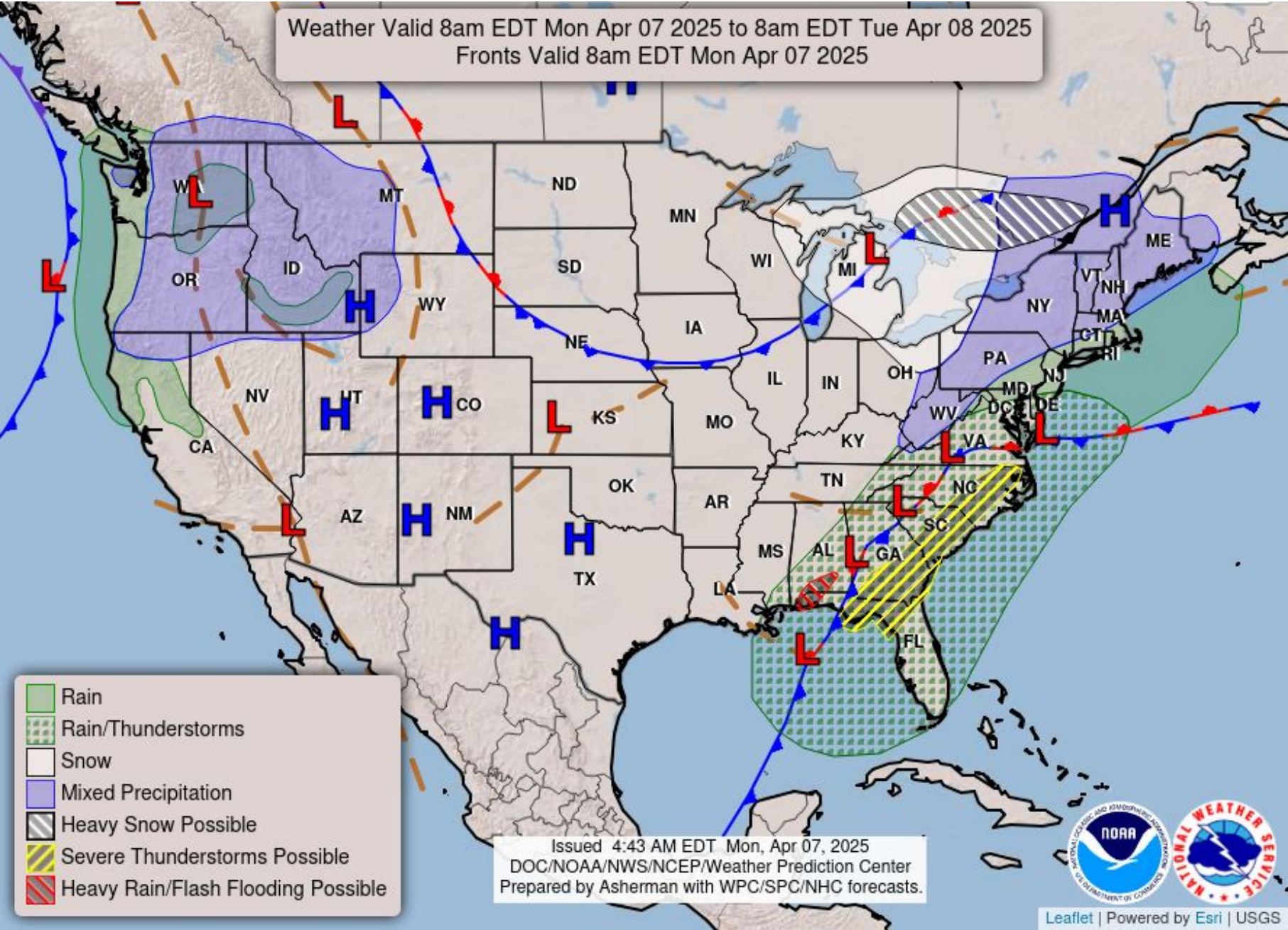

A slow moving cold front sweeps through the region bringing the threats of strong to severe thunderstorms and locally heavy rainfall.



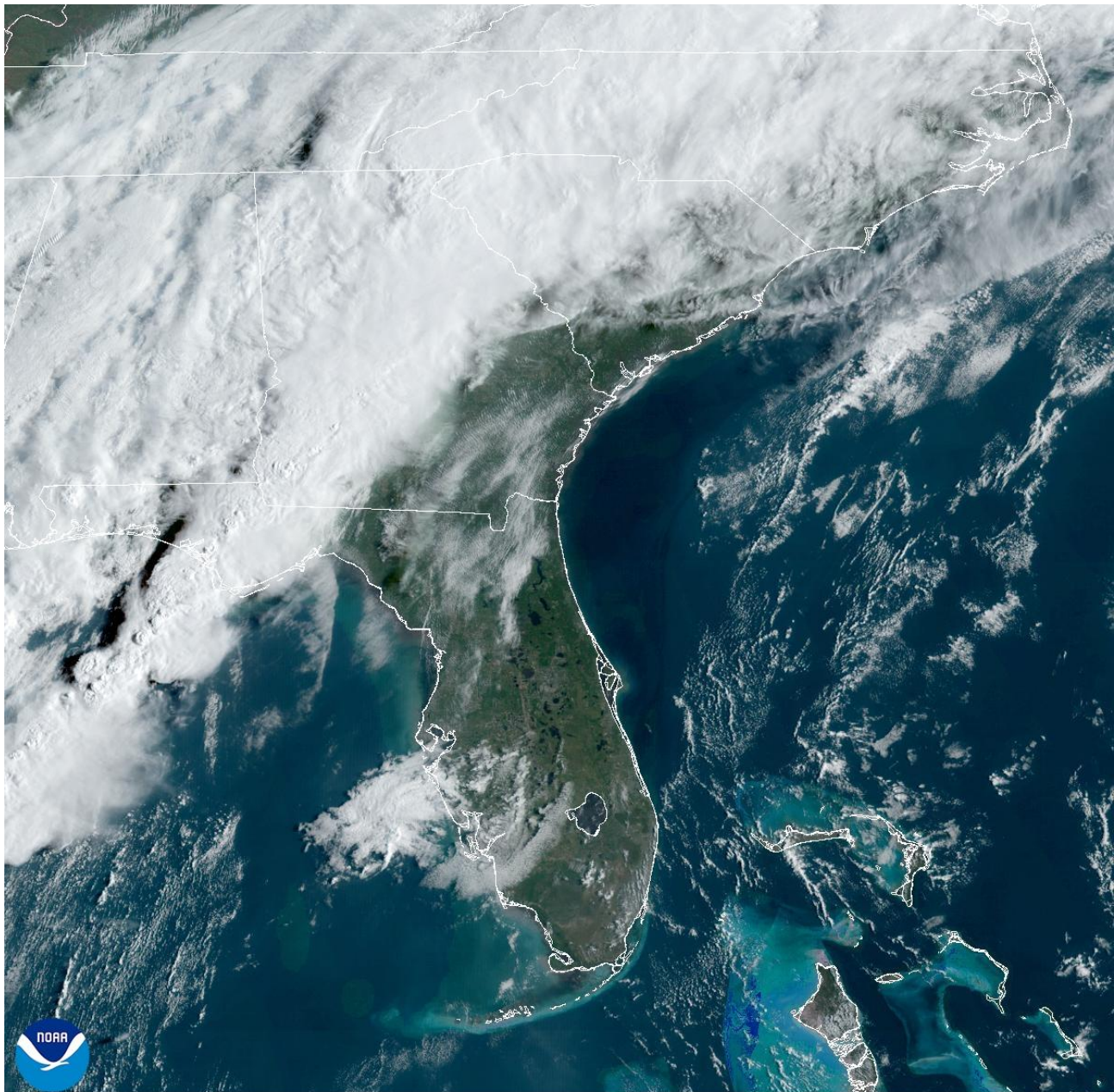




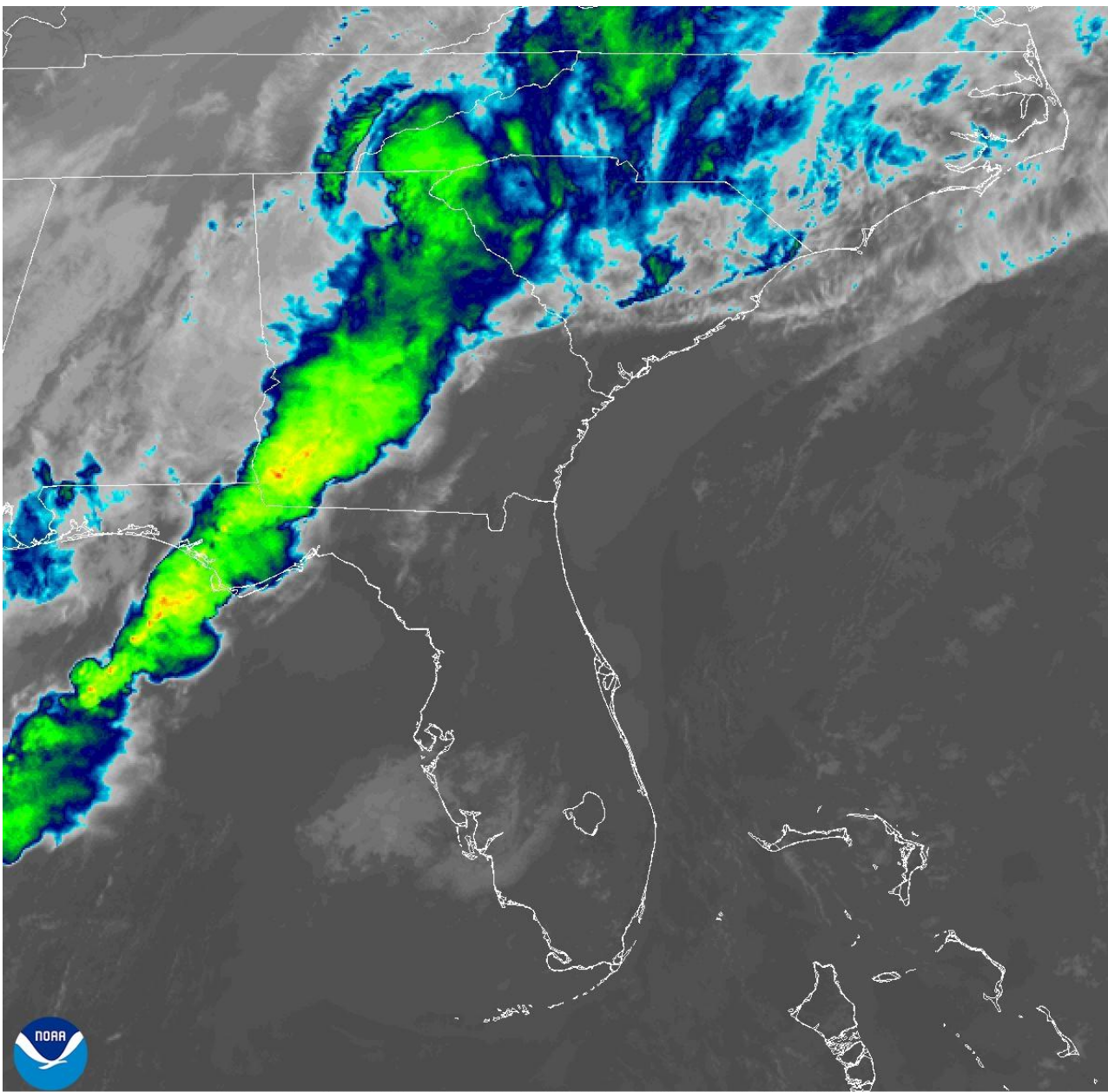

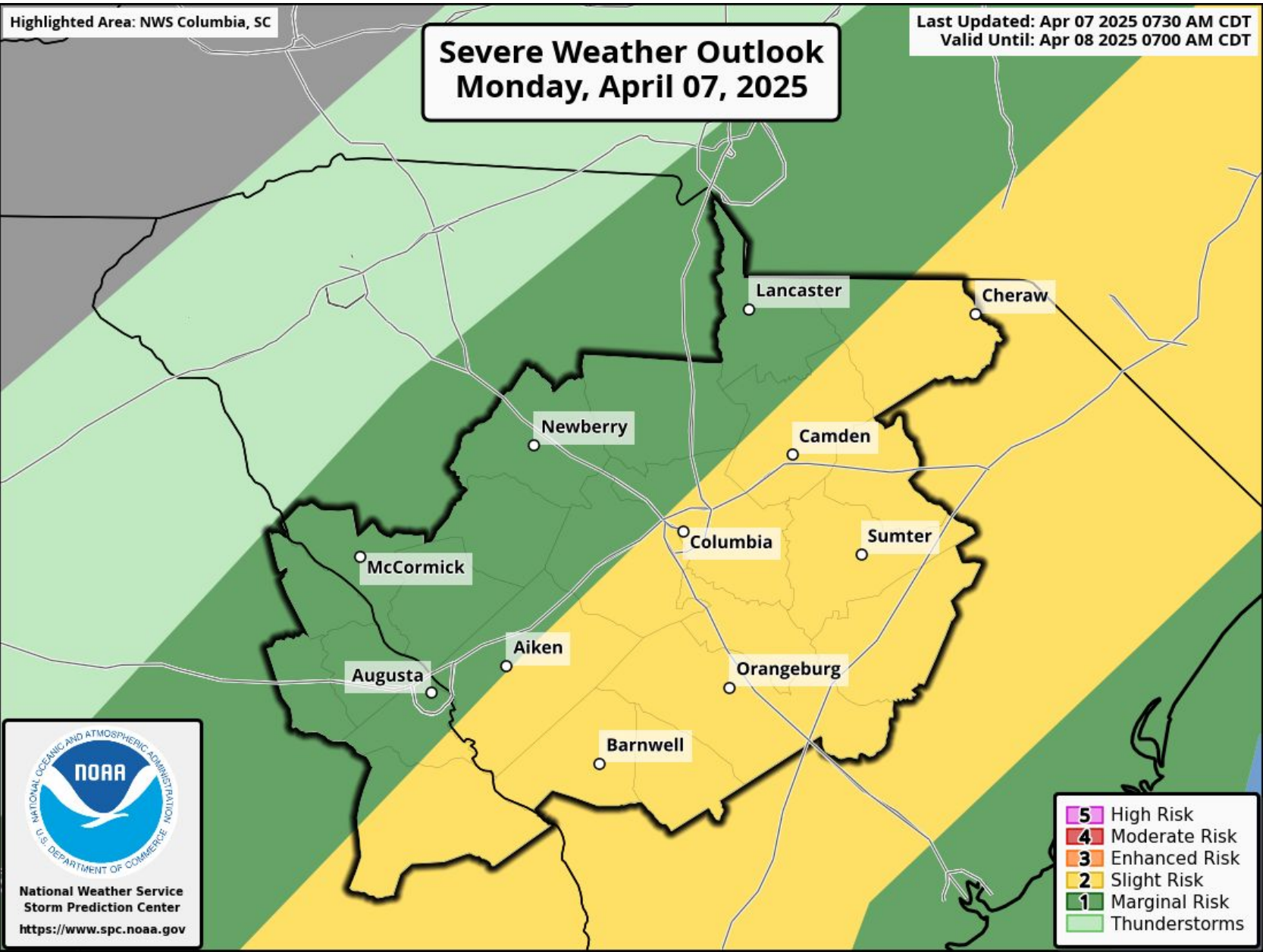


### Damaging Wind

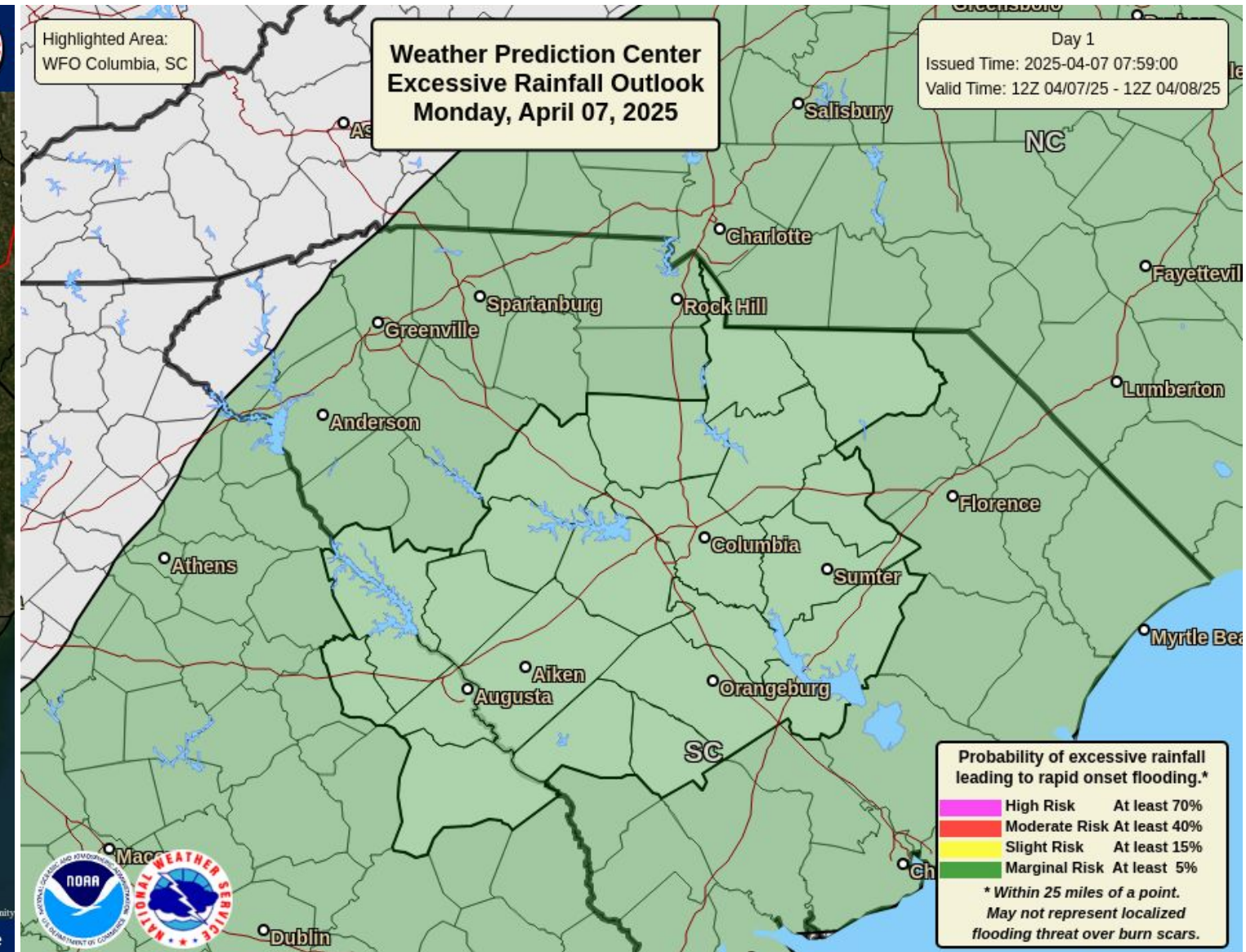
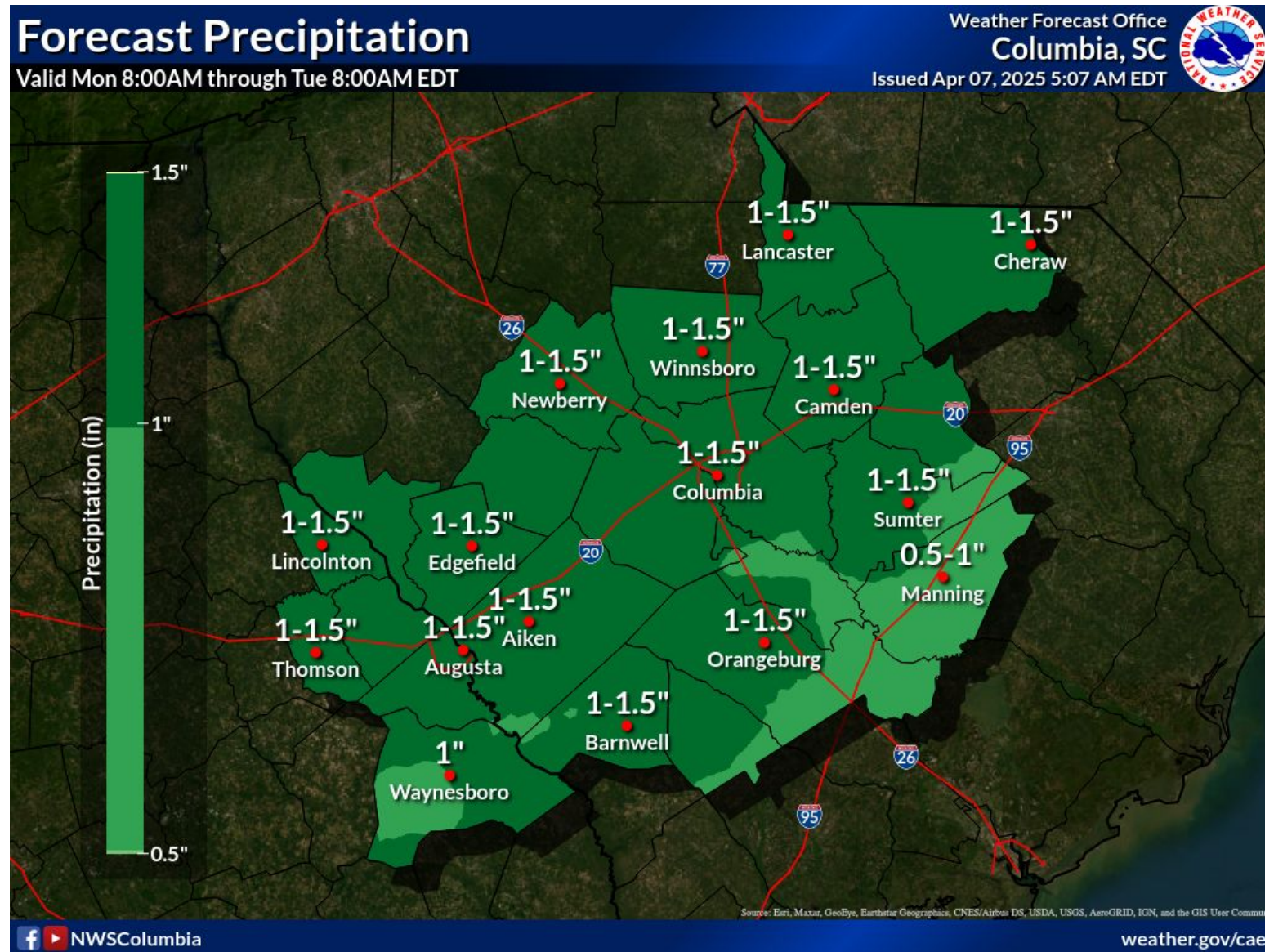




# Today's Rainfall Forecast

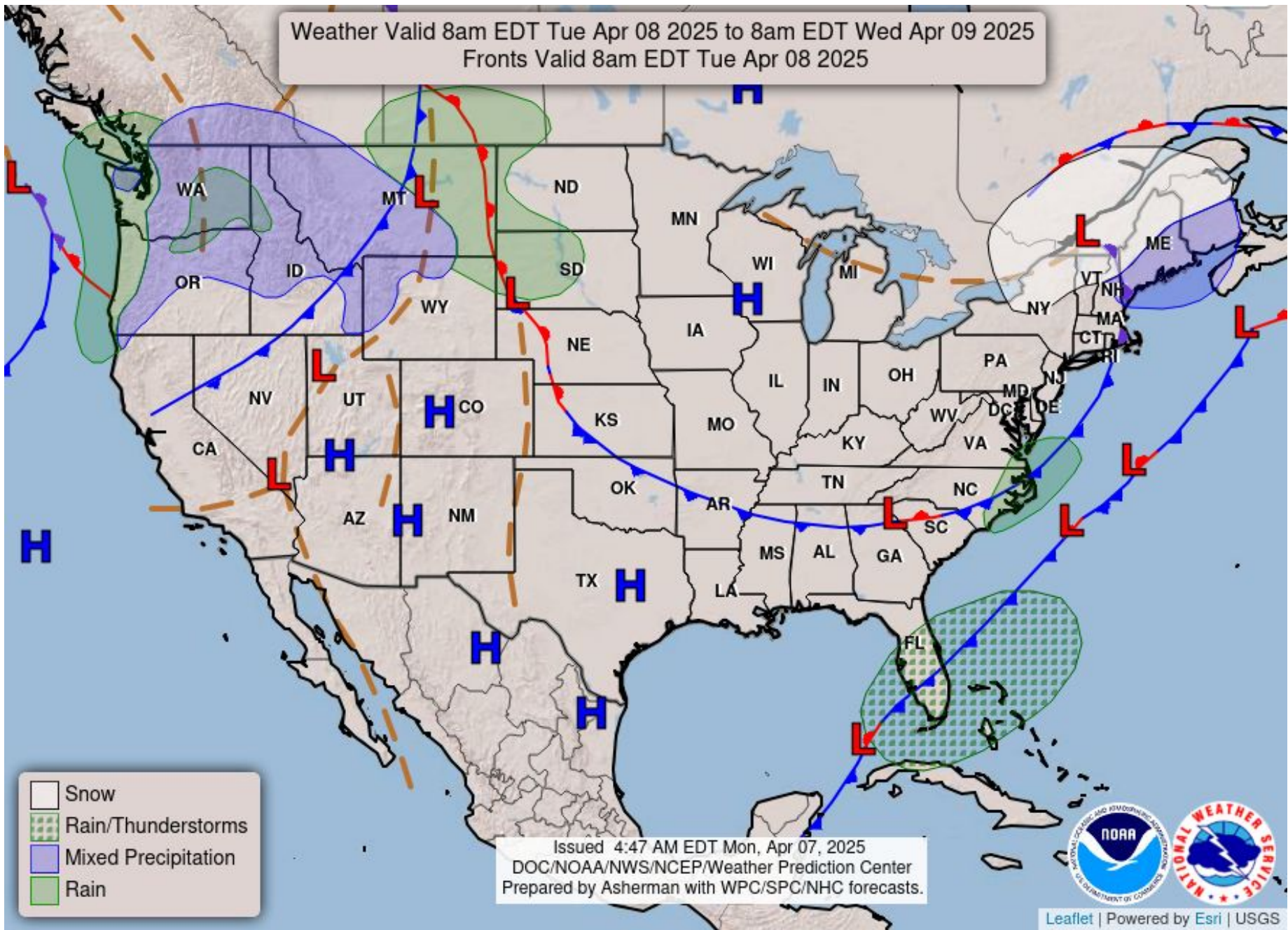

Mostly sunny and cooler behind the cold front. Low (less than 20%) risk of patchy frost across the Northern Midlands at night.

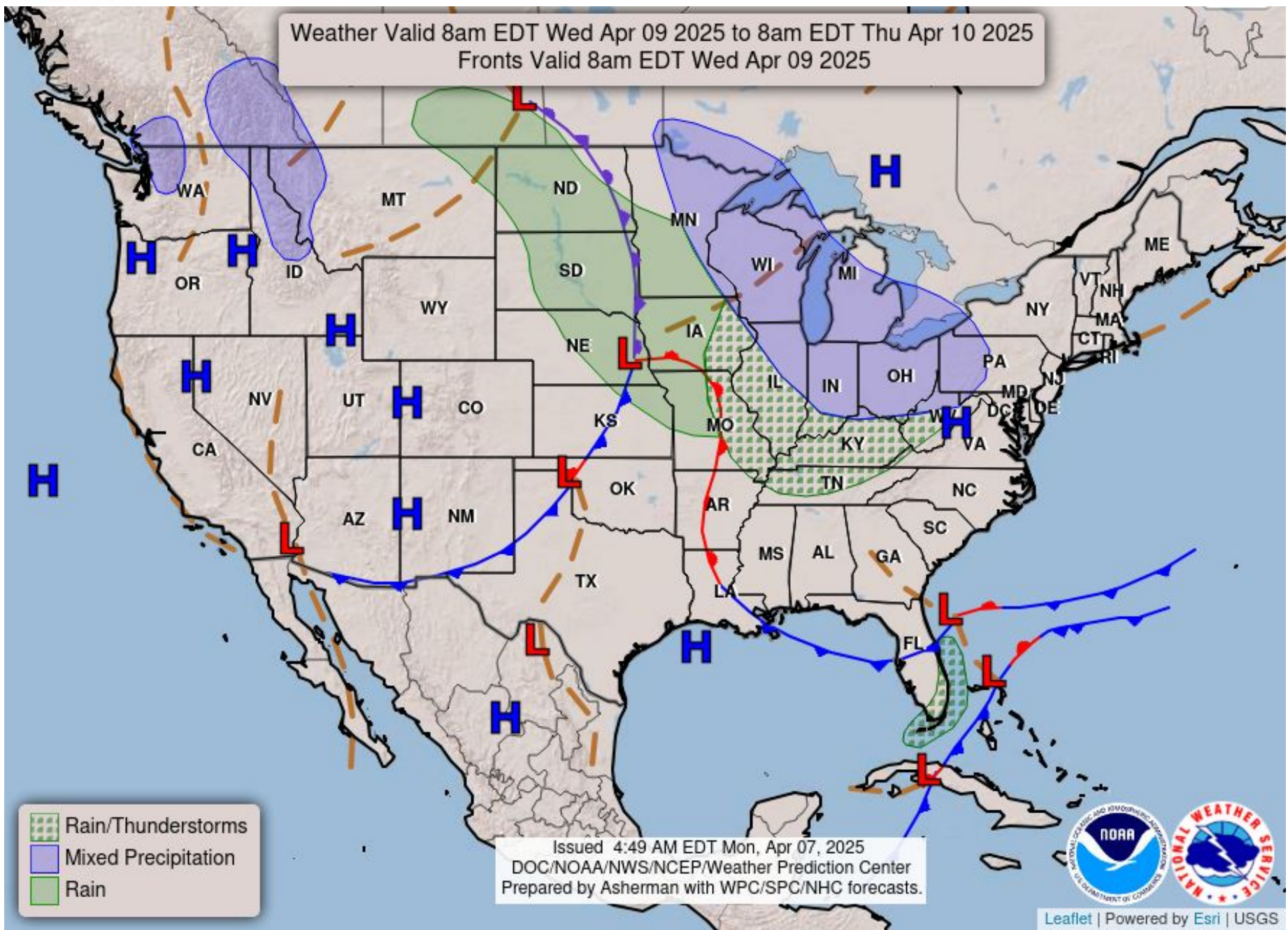

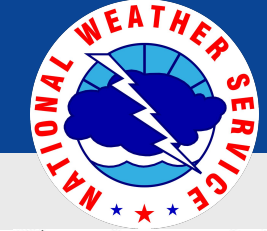

Another dry day with temperatures below seasonal values.

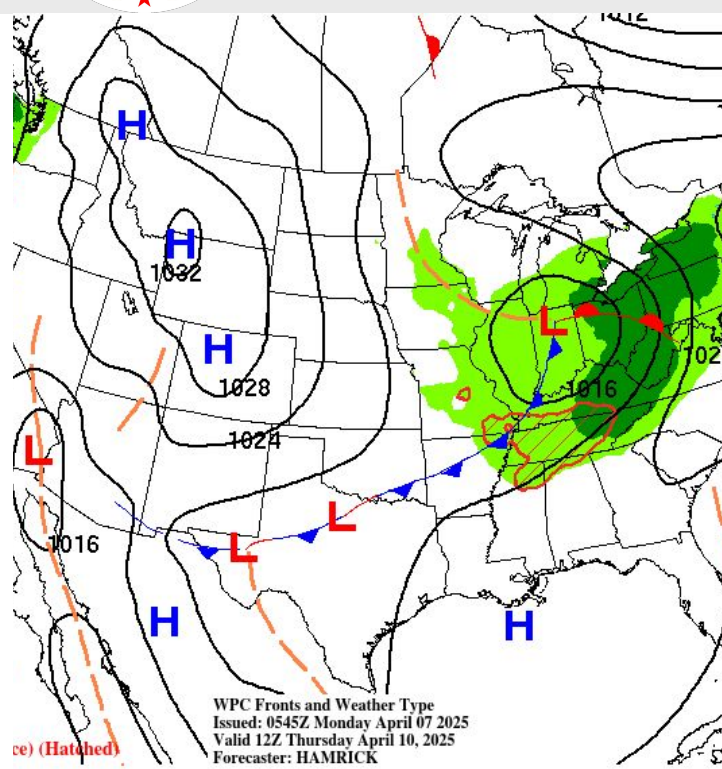




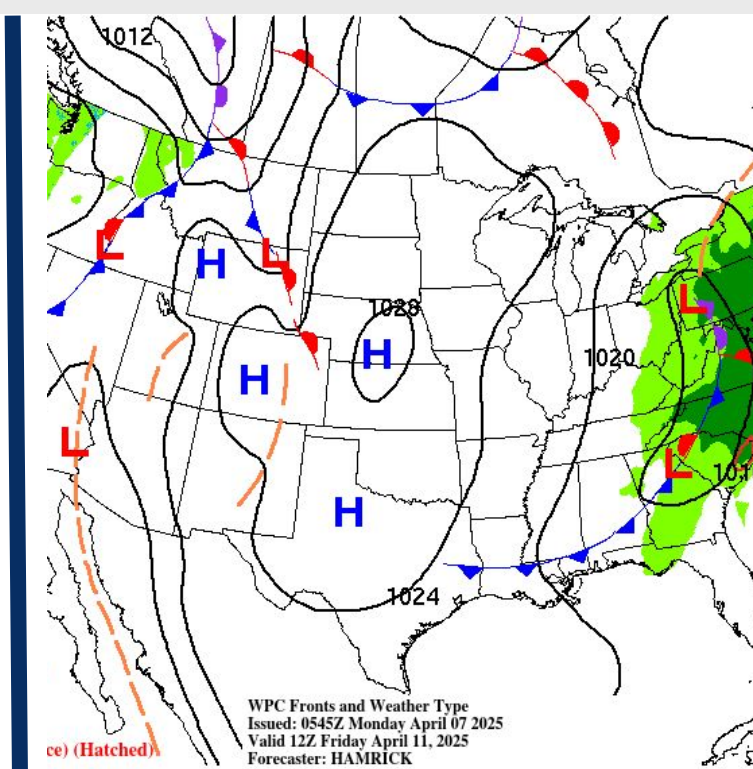

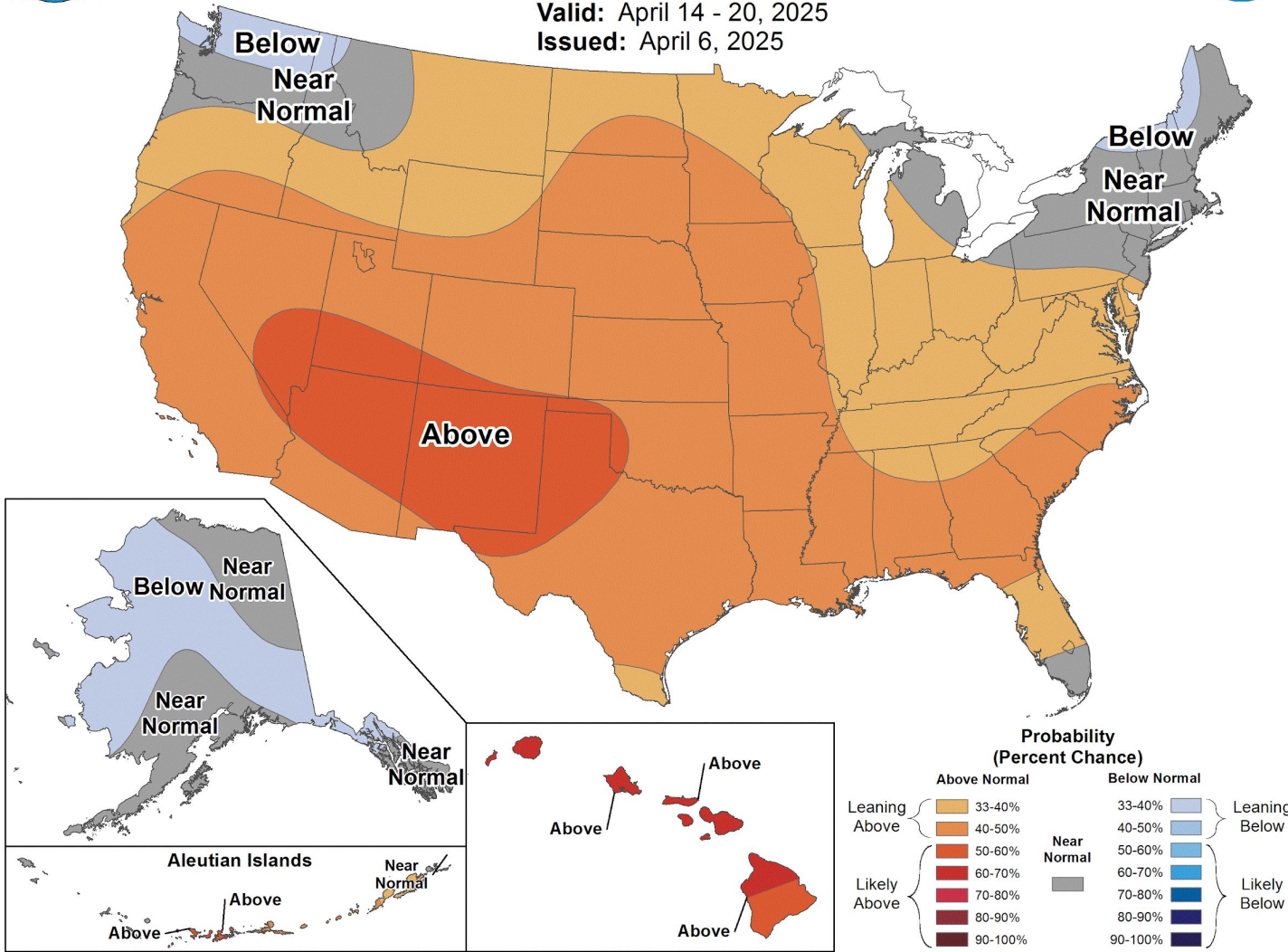

Warm and dry conditions favored in the extended.



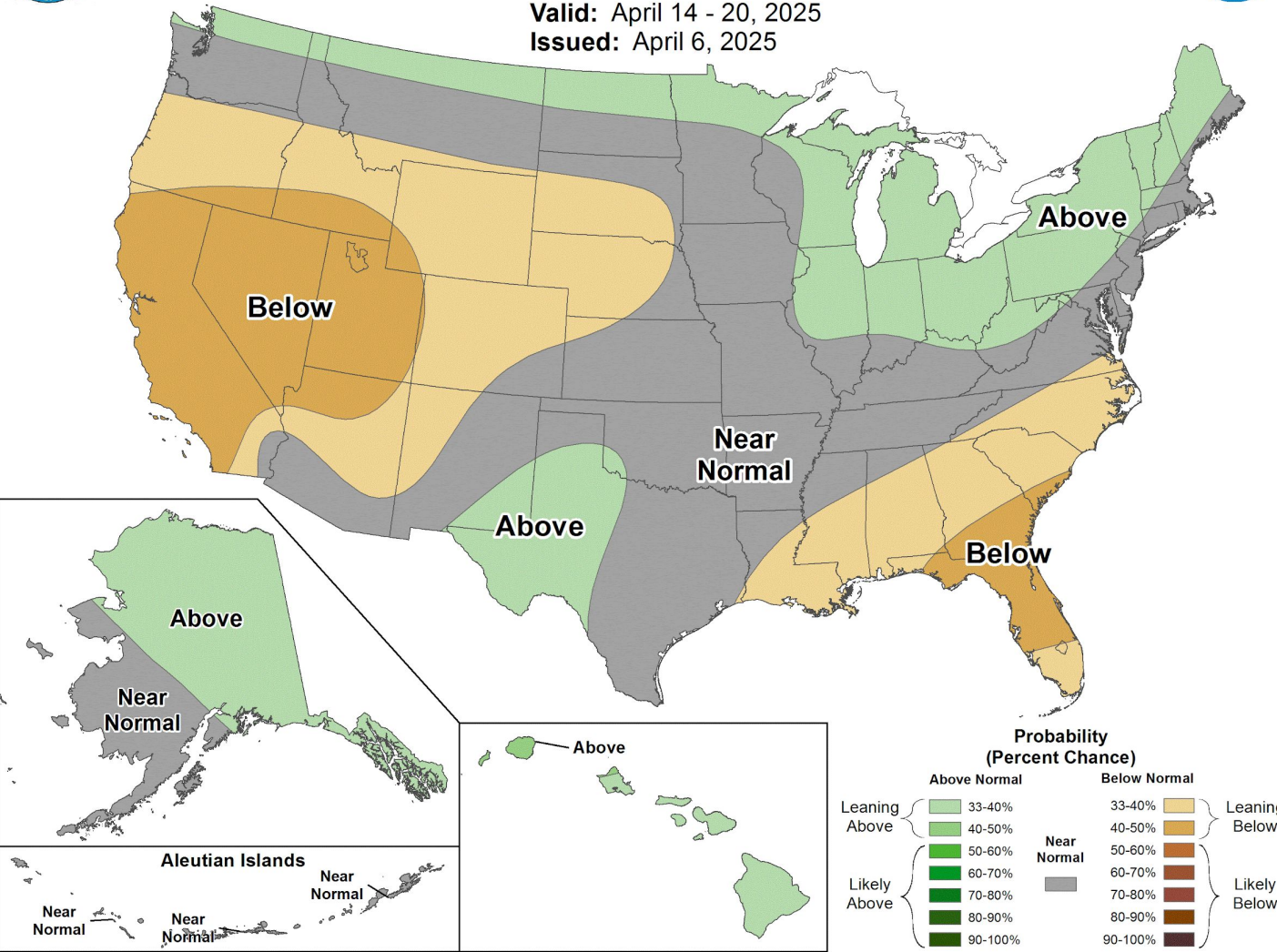
