POST TROPICAL CYCLONE REPORT...TROPICAL STORM ALBERTO NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE CHARLESTON SC 515 PM EDT FRI JUN 15 2006

TROPICAL DEPRESSION ONE FORMED DURING THE MORNING HOURS ON JUNE 10TH ABOUT 50 MILES SOUTH-SOUTHWEST OF CABO SAN ANTONIO ON THE WESTERN TIP OF CUBA. DURING THE MORNING HOURS ON THE 11TH THE DEPRESSION WAS UPGRADED TO TROPICAL STORM ALBERTO. AT THAT TIME ALBERTO WAS LOCATED ABOUT 400 MILES WEST OF KEY WEST FLORIDA. AS ALBERTO HEADED FOR THE BIG BEND AREA OF THE FLORIDA PANHANDLE...A TROPICAL STORM WARNING WAS ISSUED AT 5 PM EDT ON THE 12TH FROM FLAGLER BEACH FLORIDA NORTH TO THE SAVANNAH RIVER. AT 5 AM EDT ON THE 13TH...THE TROPICAL STORM WARNING WAS EXTENDED NORTHWARD TO THE SOUTH SANTEE RIVER. ALBERTO MADE LANDFALL DURING THE MIDDAY HOURS ON THE 13TH NEAR KEATON BEACH FLORIDA AND THEN CONTINUED TO MOVE STEADILY TO THE NORTHEAST. ALBERTO HAD THE GREATEST IMPACT ON THE AREA FROM THE MIDDAY HOURS ON ON THE 13TH TO THE EARLY MORNING HOURS ON THE 14TH. ALBERTO WEAKENED TO A DEPRESSION AT 5 AM ON THE 14TH AND ALL TROPICAL STORM WARNINGS WERE DROPPED AT THAT TIME. ALBERTO PRODUCED GENERALLY 1.5 TO 4.5 INCHES OF RAIN ACROSS THE CHARLESTON COUNTY WARNING AREA WITH ISOLATED AMOUNTS FROM 5 TO NEAR 7 INCHES. IN ADDITION...SEVERAL TORNADOES OCCURRED.
