


Potential for Severe Weather area wide Saturday

Strong to severe storms are possible Saturday afternoon and night.

Storm Threats:

- > Flash Flooding
- Damaging winds
- Large hail
- A few tornadoes






















Saturday- Rain chances increase over all of N/C TX. With threat for severe storms & flooding



Sunday- Flood/Severe wx threat continue, especially near and south of I-20/30 corridor





Sunday Eve/Monday AM- Transition to mainly rain/snow and all snow for areas generally along and NW of a Killeen to DFW to Bonham line













Flash Flood Watch from 6 AM Sat – 6 AM Mon

National Weather Service Fort Worth

A Flash Flood Watch goes into effect starting 6 AM Saturday through 6 AM Monday.

Heavy rain due to showers & storms, combined with the wet fall/early winter will result in the potential for Flash Flooding & River Flooding.

If you have travel plans Saturday into Monday, along and east of I-35, be aware of an enhanced flood risk












Saturday's Traveler's Forecast










Summary

*Some tornadoes will be possible.

*Scattered storm activity today will become more widespread tonight along and behind a slow moving cold front.

*Heavy rainfall likely with greatest flooding potential east of a Bowie to Waco line.
