The Washburn Tunnel was flooded and impassable while Interstate 10 at Federal Street's bypass was under water. Sections of Sims, Halls, and Hunting Bayous with Vogel and White Oak Creeks experienced significant flooding. Homes along these bayous and creeks had flood water in them from 2 to 8 inches to as high as 18 to 20 inches.
