Forecast Highlights

Across east-central and southeast Illinois, numerous streams and rivers remain elevated, but water levels are near or past the expected high water level in many locations. Away from the main stem rivers, a few isolated roads remain flooded.

- A gradual decline in water levels is expected along the Little Wabash and Embarras Rivers. Some additional rises are
 possible along the Wabash River. Minor to moderate flooding will continue along these river basins through this
 week.
- Overland flood waters have begun to recede from low lying and other flood prone areas. Water should continue to recede in the coming days.

Showers and isolated thunderstorms return mid-week, with a 50-80% chance of rain on Wednesday and a 40-50% chance on Thursday. Total rainfall amounts should generally be less than 0.50", with just a 10-20% chance of higher amounts. Severe storms are not expected.

Seasonably cool conditions will result in a few more chances for near-freezing low temperatures, including Tuesday night (east of I-57) and Friday night (east of I-55). A hard freeze (temperatures below 28 degrees) is not expected. The cold temperatures could threaten sensitive early season vegetation.








Latest Weather Headlines



Peak Wind Gusts Wednesday





Breezy south-southeasterly wind gusts are expected during the day Wednesday.








Temperatures Next Few Days















7-Day Precipitation Outlook



Observed and Forecast River Stages








River Forecasts: Embarras River (Ste. Marie and Lawrenceville)











River Forecasts: Wabash River (Terre Haute and Hutsonville)











River Forecasts: Wabash River (Terre Haute and Hutsonville)











River Forecasts: Wabash River (Mt. Carmel and New Harmony)










River Forecasts: Little Wabash River
















8 to 14 Day Temperature and Precipitation Outlooks
