Severe storms and floods hit the Low Rolling Plains late on the 17th into the 18th. Golfball-size hail was reported west of Guthrie (by the King County Sheriff's Office) and by the public at Pitchfork Ranch just west of the Dickens-King County border. Weak, brief tornadoes were reported by sheriff's offices; one was 15 miles west of Guthrie, another was 4 miles southwest of Guthrie, and the other was 8 miles west of Dickens. No damages were reported. The heavy rains flooded Highway 82 east of Guthrie and Highway 83 south of Guthrie, as well as Ash Creek in eastern King County.
