Since record keeping began in Washington D.C. in 1871, there have only been two other years where a string of 8 consecutive days that reached 95 degrees or above has been recorded.

High pressure off the Atlantic Coast pumped hot and humid air into the Mid-Atlantic region. This caused high temperatures to reach between 92 and 100 degrees August 1st through the 5th. Dew points in the upper 60s to mid 70s forced heat indexes to soar to between 98 and 110 degrees. Seven residents of Baltimore County and Prince George's County succumbed to the excessive heat. In Baltimore City, a 56 year old man and a 74 year old man were found dead in their home on the 5th. On the 6th, an 88 year old man was found dead in his home. On the 7th, a 36 year old man being held in jail was found dead in his cell from heat related causes. In Baltimore County, a 30 year old woman was found dead in her home. In Prince George's County, a 51 year old woman died in her home on the 5th. On the 7th, a 46 year old man died from a combination of drug use and the heat. In Frederick County, eleven people in participating in an outdoor activity in Ijamsville were treated for heat illnesses. The heat was also blamed for buckling pavement on Interstate 70 near the Route 355 exit. Several thunderstorms with high winds, large hail, and frequent lightning moved through western and central Maryland between 2 and 6 PM EDT. In Allegany County, a few trees and power lines were downed in Cumberland. Pea sized hail was also reported. In Frederick County, a 52 year old man was killed by lightning while standing on the back porch of his Frederick home. It was not raining at the time he was struck. A 17 year old swimming pool lifeguard at Fort Detrick was injured when lightning struck nearby. He had just evacuated the pool and was walking toward the pool house when he was struck. A 36 year old Frederick County man was also injured by lightning in an unknown location. At least 4 homes across the county were damaged by lightning and 2000 bales of hay were set on fire near Emmitsburg. Wind damage was reported in Park Mills. Marble to quarter sized hail fell just south of Frederick for nearly 10 minutes. In Carroll County, dime sized hail fell in Eldersburg. In Baltimore County, quarter sized hail fell on miles northwest of Baltimore. Trees were downed in Owings Mills. In Howard County, quarter sized hail fell in Scaggsville. A home on Talon Court in Clarksville burned to the ground after being struck by lightning. In Montgomery County, trees were uprooted, roofs were damaged, and windows were blown out in Derwood. Many large branches were downed in Layhill where 2.5 inches of rain fell. A tree was downed onto Cashell Road in Olney. In Prince Georges County, penny sized hail fell in Camp Springs. Pea sized hail fell in Bowie and College Park. Trees were downed in Seat Pleasant. Several tree limbs were downed in Hyattsville. A house in Suitland caught fire after being struck by lightning and one person was slightly injured at the scene.

Thunderstorms with large hail and damaging winds pushed through several Northern Virginia communities between 6 and 9 PM EDT. In Alexandria, nickel sized hail was reported. Trees were also downed in the city. In Fairfax County, the Mason Neck area was hardest hit. High winds downed numerous trees, including 40 that were blown over on 20 acres of private property along the Potomac River just north of Gunston Hall. A garage was heavily damaged by a downed tree. Extensive tree damage was also reported in Pohick Park. So many trees were downed that trails and picnic areas had to be closed. A second storm caused damage in the Mount Vernon area. A number of trees were downed onto yards and homes in the Waynewood and Stratford Landing subdivisions. In the Belle View area, trees were downed on the George Washington Parkway and Morningside Lane. In Prince William County, numerous trees were downed along the Route 1 corridor from Woodbridge to Dumfries. Marble sized hail was reported at the Quantico Marine Corps Base. Numerous thunderstorms with high winds, large hail, frequent lightning, and heavy downpours moved through the region between 2 and 8 PM EDT. In Nelson County, trees were downed in Arrington and Piedmont. Flood waters covered Route 56 in Shipman. In Augusta County, trees were downed in Mint Spring. Two campers were injured by lightning in Natural Chimneys Regional Park near Mt. Solon. They were holding onto an awning when lightning struck and they both sustained minor injuries. Lightning also downed trees onto two cars and a mobile home nearby. In Highland County, a few trees were downed in Mill Gap. In Rockingham County, the hardest hit community was Harrisonburg. Two buildings, in the heart of downtown on Main and North Liberty streets,

lost their roofs to high winds. Roof debris crashed down onto nearby streets and utility lines. Numerous trees were downed and marble to dime sized hail fell. Two inches of rain fell in 30 minutes. In Bridgewater, heavy downpours caused a storm drain to be pushed out of the ground. Pea sized hail was also reported. In Shenandoah County, golfball sized hail fell in Mt. Jackson. Trees were downed in Fort Valley. In Warren County, 2.17 inches of rain was recorded at Manassas Gap. Minor flooding was reported in the northern and eastern portions of the county. Trees were downed in Edinburg. A home in the Point of Woods area was destroyed by a lightning fire. In Frederick County, dime sized hail was reported in Winchester.

In Fauquier County, a tree was blown onto a truck in Midland. A man inside was trapped, but uninjured. In Culpeper County, trees were downed onto Edwards Shop Road and Kelly Ford Road in the southeastern portion of the county. In Orange County, trees were downed in Lake of the Woods. One tree fell onto a car and two trees fell onto homes. In Spotsylvania County, dime sized hail fell in Fredericksburg. Trees were downed 12 miles west of Fredericksburg. A home in Spotsylvania was damaged by lightning. In Stafford County, dime sized hail fell in Heflin. In Fairfax County, dime sized hail fell in Reston and Annandale. Quarter sized hail was reported in Centreville, Fairfax, and just south of Chantilly. In Greenbriar, a spotter reported 30 straight minutes of hail. During this time, large hail up to a quarter in size fell for 10 minutes and dented cars. In Fairfax, a spotter reported a wind gust in excess of 50 MPH. Several trees were downed in the Centreville where a spotter estimated a wind gust of 70 MPH and 2 inches of rain in less than 40 minutes. Lightning set a townhouse in Springfield and a home in Fairfax on fire.

In Prince William County, nearly 2 million dollars in damage was reported in the Manassas area. A wind gust of 67 MPH was recorded at the Manassas Airport. An unofficial wind gust of 89.7 MPH was recorded atop the airport control tower as it was being evacuated. Several buildings on the airport grounds sustained damage, including a hangar which lost a quarter of its roof and a door. Two airplanes were destroyed and three were damaged. A commercial blimp was torn away from its mooring and blown one half mile away from the airport. A person who was trying to secure the blimp was carried along with it and sustained minor injuries when the craft landed. The high winds downed numerous trees in Manassas, Manassas Park, and Sudley. In addition, dime to quarter sized hail fell in Manassas and Manassas Park for over 20 minutes. Extensive roof, siding, and vehicle damage resulted. Very heavy downpours also caused minor flooding on streets. An observer in Manassas Park reported a total of 5.25 inches of rainfall in only 90 minutes.

High pressure sitting off the Atlantic coastline pumped hot and humid air into the region between August 12th and 19th. Temperatures soared well into the 90s during the afternoon each day and heat index values approached 100 degrees. Several high temperature records were broken during the heat wave. At Dulles International Airport, a record high temperature of 98 degrees was reached on the 12th and 13th. On the 18th, a new record high of 97 was set and on the 19th the mercury reached a record setting 95 degrees. At Washington Reagan National Airport, a record high temperature of 99 degrees was set on the 14th. The mercury rose to a record breaking 98 degrees on the 18th and 19th. Since record keeping began in Washington D.C. in 1871, there have only been two other years where a string of 8 consecutive days that reached 95 degrees or above has been recorded.
