- Much of the region was below normal precipitation for the month with the exception of the central and eastern Permian Basin.
- Temperatures were just above normal for much of the area outside Southeast New Mexico.
- KMAF was very near normal for both temperature and precipitation for the second straight month.
- Severe weather occurred in mid-April over the Permian Basin with large hail and flooding reported, as shown below.
