Midland County Midland Flash Flood 13 0550CST 0800CST An off-duty National Weather Service employee reported half a foot of water flowing over the north frontage road of Business 20 at the intersection of Loop 250 and Business 20. **Ector County** 0 0 20K 0 Flash Flood Odessa to 5 SW Odessa 13 0630CST The Odessa Fire Department performed three high water rescues, two at the intersection of West County Road and Interstate 20 and the other on the service road of Interstate 20 just north of the intersection with Meadow Avenue.
